



Happy Holidays from the Town of Rushford Board! Enclosed is information on tax payments, Winnebago County Tax Collection Policy, recycling, and township news.

First installments and full payments of taxes are due and payable to the **TOWN OF RUSHFORD** on or before January 31, 2022. Because of the Holidays, we will NOT be collecting taxes at the Town Hall on the last Saturday of December, but we will be collecting taxes at the Town Hall on January 29, 2022 from 10 am – 2 pm. You can either send your tax payments in the mail or drop them off at our drop box located in front of the town hall. **NO CASH payments will be accepted this year.** The Town will not be sending out receipt of payment for your taxes. If you would like one, please enclose a self addressed, stamped envelope with your payment. You may view your tax bill online at <http://www.co.winnebago.wi.us/>
Just click on Property Inquiry under Property, Environment and Maps.

There are no immediate refunds for overpayment of taxes according to State Statues. Refund checks will be mailed the day after the town board meetings which will be Thursday, January 6th and Thursday, February 3, 2022.

All second installments of taxes are due and payable to Winnebago County Treasurer on or before July 31, 2022. If you would like to receive a receipt, please enclose a self addressed stamped envelope with your payment to the County. Enclosed is an updated Winnebago County Collection Policy for your information.

DOG LICENSES: All dogs five months or older must be licensed and you must have proof of rabies vaccination. It is required by law AND your dog must be licensed every year. The license runs from January to December. This year, owners will be fined if your dog is picked up and not licensed.

Dog Licenses Prices:

Spayed or neutered dogs	\$ 5.00
Unspayed or unneutered dogs	\$10.00



LOTTERY CREDITS: If a lottery credit does not appear on your tax bill, you can still claim one. You will qualify if you own a home in Wisconsin and use it as your primary residence on January 1st of the year in which property taxes are levied. Primary residence is defined as the home where an individual lives more than six months of the year. If temporarily absent, it is the home to which the owner returns. Only one primary residence may be claimed, and renters do not qualify. Contact Kathryn Lewis to claim a credit. If you have any questions, please call Kathryn at 920-379-4538 or email Kathryn.

PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR FIRE NUMBERS ARE CLEARLY POSTED FOR THE FIRST RESPONDERS AND EMERGENCY VEHICLES. This is a must for fast and prompt service from our first responders. Please try to trim trees or bushes away from your number. Remember that the fire number is your responsibility. If you do not have a fire number, please leave your name and address by contacting the Town.

If you are considering a new driveway, need a burning permit or have any town problems, please call your Supervisors – Patrick Kafer and Jerry Schoonover. Weekly trash is picked up on Tuesdays and single stream recyclables being picked up every other week. This means all your recyclables can be placed together.
